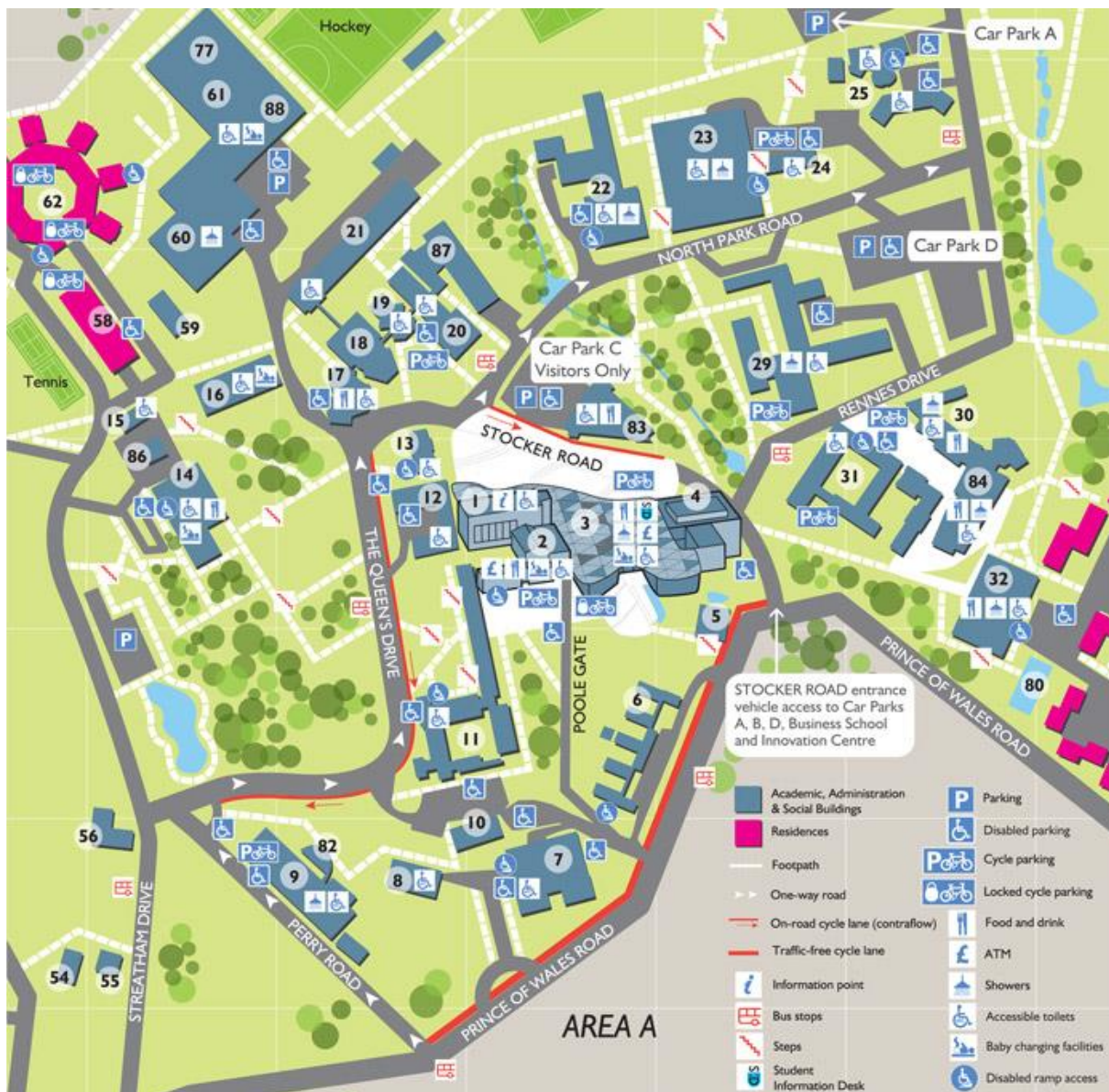
Getting to the TARC Workshop
